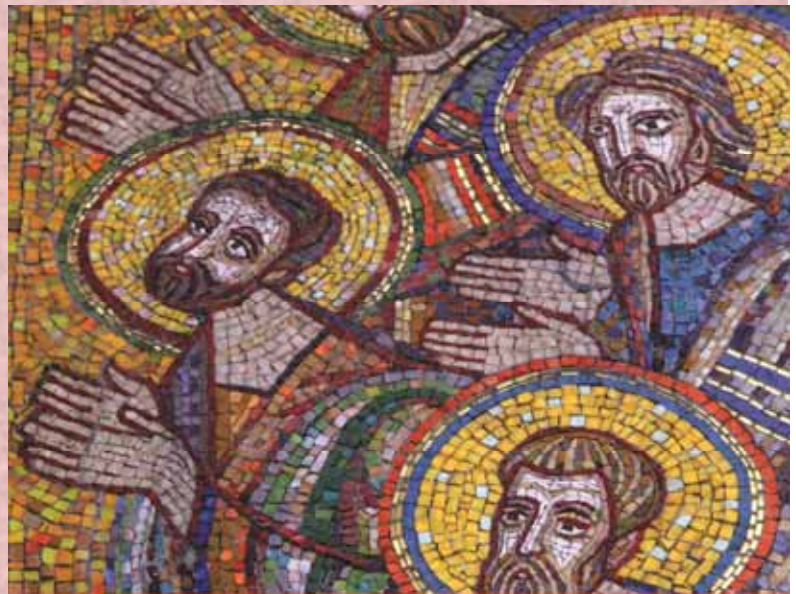

### THE SACRAMENT OF FIRST CONFESSION AND FIRST HOLY

**COMMUNION** - Second grade is the normal time. One year prior Religious Education is required.

**THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS** - Men should call the parish priest or the Diocesan Vocation Director to help them discern their call to the Diaconate or Priesthood.

**THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** - Couples should make an appointment with the priest or deacon at the time of engagement and at least six months in advance of any wedding date to begin preparations. No date should be set before that meeting so all canonical requirements are met. One party must be registered at our church and an active Catholic. All weddings take place inside the Church.

**THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF SICK** - The anointing of the sick can be administered to anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness. Please call the church office to make arrangements to be anointed. In an emergency, please use ext. 1, leave a message with your name and phone number. You will be contacted as soon as possible.

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**DIFFICULTY, SURVIVAL, AND GLORY**

In Revelation, John the Evangelist tells us what we can expect as followers of the risen Jesus: distress, endurance, and a kingdom. Although we are only eight days into our fifty-day Easter feasting, we cannot ignore the distress weighing down our daily lives. Jesus' resurrection does not erase individual suffering, but his glorious triumph over death cultivates endurance in our hearts. We remember that Jesus did not spare himself, and we ask for the strength to endure as he did. Imitating Christ helps us grow as members of God's royal family. As beloved citizens of the Kingdom of God, we recognize our kinship with all people. Peter demonstrates his care for others as he heals multitudes of broken, suffering people. In the Gospel, Thomas accepts his own spiritual healing when Jesus helps him to believe. In times of difficulty, survival, and glory, we borrow Thomas' declaration of faith: "My Lord and my God!"

## SENT

In Jesus' first appearance to his disciples, as described in today's Gospel, Jesus sends the disciples, and all who follow him: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Jesus speaks to us here: we the Church are a "sent people," sent to participate in God's mission, that is, God's purposes and activity for all of humanity. Like Jesus was sent to Israel, we are sent to witness to our world of the boundless love of God, and to offer an alternative way of living based on that love. The wounds that Jesus displayed to his disciples remind us that this new way of life often involves both dying to the familiar and comfortable, and rising to the new and unknown. When we join in efforts to challenge injustice, heal broken relationships, or care for those on the margins of society, we share in the death and resurrection of Jesus.

## THE WEEK BETWEEN

In today's Gospel, we notice there was a week between Jesus' first appearance (without Thomas), and the following appearance (with Thomas). During this week, Thomas chose to stay with the community. But why? Perhaps he trusted his friends in some way. Perhaps he reflected on their life with Jesus and on the possibility their account was true. In the week between, Thomas stayed and lived with the questions, and with his doubts. Importantly, the disciples did not cast him out as an unbeliever. It seems they accepted and loved him, just as he was.

Perhaps many of us live in this "week between." We have questions and doubts. We can choose to leave or to stay. We can either engage or ignore our deepest questions. If we embrace our questions with courage, we can live into them. Perhaps we will encounter, through God's initiative, and with the help of our companions in faith, some of the answers—and new questions along the way.

## PRIMARY DIMENSIONS

We are currently in Year C of the three-year Lectionary cycle. For the Second Sunday of Easter, in all three years, the first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles. Year A (from Acts 2) tells of the new Christian community's dedication to prayer. Year B (from Acts 4) tells of their sharing of goods and deep bonds of trust in each other. Today we hear in Acts 5 of the early Church's ministry of healing to the community, performed by Peter and the apostles.

These represent three of the primary dimensions of those first Christian communities: prayer in relationship to God; sharing in relationship to each other; and service in relationship to the world around them. We are reminded that all three are fundamental to our identity as Church. We fail to live fully as Church when we neglect any of these relationships. We are called to encourage their full flowering in our own parish's life.

# I'm Divorced: Is There a Place for Me in Church?

During these Easter mysteries, how Jesus triumphed over sin and death, it is worth pondering how misunderstandings of what the Church teaches can be a hurtful and unnecessary obstacle to faith for well-meaning people. It is our task to help coach people to the truth when the opportunity is present. One of the most significant examples is this type of misunderstanding concerns divorce, remarriage and annulments.

Many Catholics think that the Catholic Church considers divorce to be universally a mortal sin, and an irreconcilable one at that. When someone divorces his or her spouse, so many other relationships seem estranged as well, including with the Church. Many in this situation leave at a time when these hurting souls especially need the Church. It may surprise many, but oftentimes getting divorced is actually not a sin at all. Even when it is a sin, the doors to Mass and Sacraments remain open!

**What is divorce? When is it moral or immoral? What is the relationship of divorced Catholics with the Church? When are they free to marry? These are important questions!**

In the eyes of God and the Church, divorce is only a legal separation of spouses. It changes nothing about a marriage itself, which lasts until death. Therefore getting divorced does not mean that a person is publicly disagreeing with the Church. There are sometimes very good reasons to divorce one's spouse!

The Catechism teaches that divorce is moral and even prudent when there is grave disorder in the family. This may include but is not limited to abusive behavior or addictions. In this case, there is no sin and the person who sought the divorce may continue to receive Holy Com-

munion without going to Confession first. Divorce is immoral when it is done for selfish reasons, such as desiring someone else or simply to get one's own way. If this is the case, then every realistic attempt at reconciliation should be pursued, and Confession should be received first before receiving Holy Communion. However, anyone is always welcome at Mass, whether or not s/he may receive Holy Communion!

**When is a wedding valid?** A wedding is *only* valid when *all* of the following conditions are met:

1. The bride and groom are free to marry, meaning they have no prior vows, and are able to consummate the marriage.
2. The bride and groom freely and without pressure enter into their vows, knowing what marriage is, and being aware and alert (sober) at the time of the vows.
3. The bride and groom intend to be faithful to each other until death.
4. The bride and groom are open to the possibility of having children at some time during their marriage.
5. For Catholics, another condition is that there must be witnesses, including a priest or deacon as a representation for the Church.

A wedding is invalid when any *one* of these conditions is not present at the time of the vows.

An annulment is not the same as a "Catholic divorce". Rather it comes as a healing ministry of the Church, and is a declaration, following investigation, that a wedding never was valid (real) because of one or more of the above conditions not being met by either the bride or groom. Applying for an annulment is easier and far less expensive than many guess. It also does not delegitimize your children, or mean that there was any sin involved. **"Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed,"** Jesus says in today's Gospel. For those who have not seen to believe, however, we must be good stewards of our faith, living it joyfully and sharing generously. Then, in our time too, "men and women in great numbers" will be "added to the Lord."
