THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - Men should call the parish priest
or the Diocesan Vocation Director to help them discern their call to the
Diaconate or Priesthood.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - Couples should make an appoint-
ment with the priest or deacon at the time of engagement and at least
six months in advance of any wedding date to begin preparations. No
date should be set before that meeting so all canonical requirements are
met. One party must be registered and an active Catholic. All weddings
take place inside the Church.

sick can be administered to anyone suffering from a serious or chronic

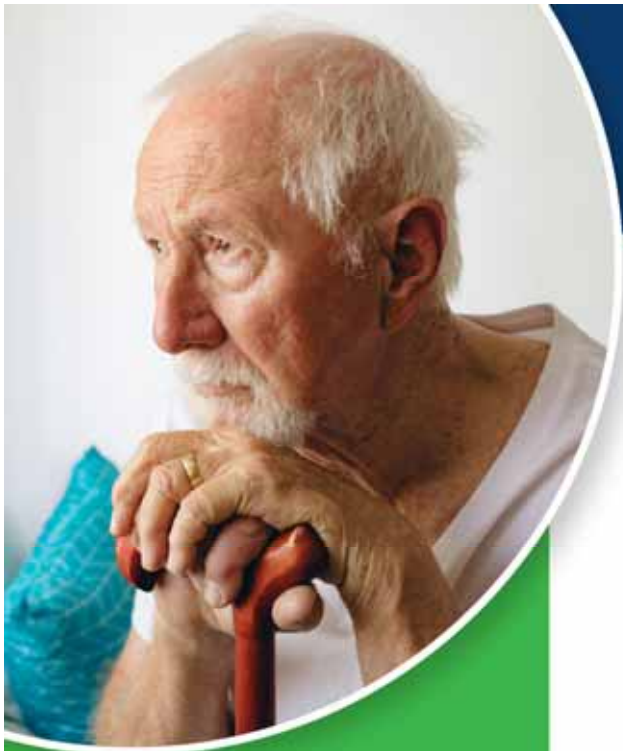

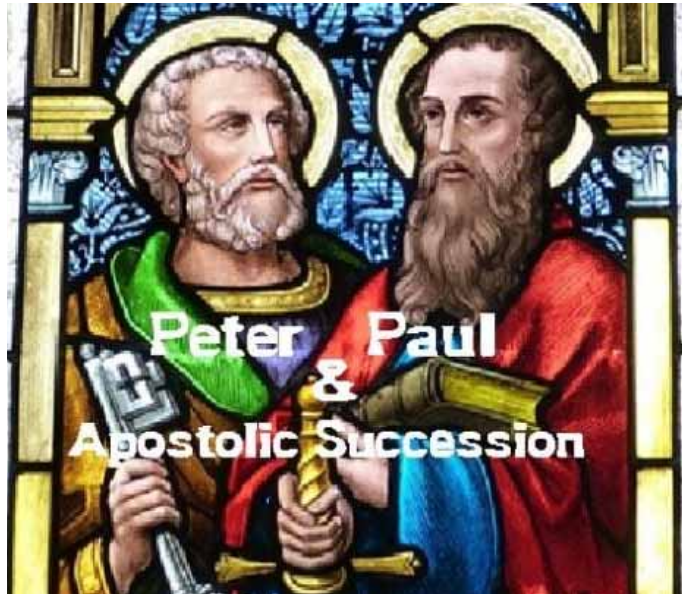

Apostolic succession is the doctrine that the bishops of the Catholic Church perpetuate ordinations that go historically in succession to the Apostles of Christ. The Catholic Church can actually follow the line of each bishop right back to Jesus.



Jesus Christ gave His apostles His authority to carry to the world after His ascension. While on earth, Jesus taught them the Truth of faith, rooted in the Will of the Father, to be protected by the Holy Spirit. When Jesus appeared after the resurrection, He told His apostles:

“As the Father has sent Me, so I send you” (John 20:21).

“Whoever listens to you listens to Me. Whoever rejects you rejects Me. And whoever rejects Me rejects the One who sent Me” (Luke 10:16).

“Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven” (Matthew 16:18; 18:18).

Peter and the others were only the first, not the last, not the only ones to carry out Christ’s authority. Those guys appointed others who spread the Truth, who appointed others, and others, and, etc. It is important to remember that the writing of the Church fathers are parallel to scripture, not separate. For example, St. Ignatius of Antioch was a student of the apostle John. Ignatius learned from John all John had

learned from Jesus. Ignatius taught that we should look upon the Bishop as if we are looking upon Christ, Himself. Why? Because the Bishops, particularly the Bishop of Rome, has the distinct task of protecting, teaching, modeling the AUTHENTIC TEACHINGS of Jesus.

Because these teachings are protected in this way, early Christians turned to those with Apostolic succession and the churches they established to determine the difference between Truth and heresy. These Truths are held for us in the writings of the Church fathers, in the writings of the

Popes, and in the Catechism. They are accessible to every Catholic seeking an answer.

The line of apostolic succession will continue into the future of the Church. Does that mean there has not been, or will never be Bishops that deviate from authentic teaching? Of course not! Although the anointing of ordination offers graces to protect the ordained, humans still have free will and Satan will do his best to destroy the Church from the inside. Satan works overtime on the Church and her priests, which is why praying for them is so IMPORTANT!

Apostolic succession is a beautiful gift given to the Church by Christ to ensure her mission will be faithfully carried out until the second coming. We participate in this mission by being authentic disciples in a world where relativism, secularism, and materialism fight to control the hearts and minds of all.

There's so much fake news around us, it's hard to know what to believe. This you can believe - at St. Barnabas we have the most dedicated, hard working bunch in the St. Vincent de Paul pantry group. Every Wednesday they spend hours packing boxes of food for the families that come on Thursday between 11am and 2pm. On Thursday they arrive around 9 or 9:30am. At 2pm, when the pantry closes for the day, they don't just go home. They restock any boxes back on the shelves that did not get distributed. Ingles should be so lucky as to have workers like we have.



There are two different types of boxes, one for those with regular needs, and the other with foods that our Hispanic friends eat. If there is something they would like, they ask,

and if we have it its given to them. We are one of the few pantries that have diapers, so we sometimes have a lot of calls for them. If you notice this has been the list of things needed lately.

It has been a little surprising, even disheartening, that in recent weeks the number of families coming for food has decreased, yet we continue to hear much about food insecurity in our community. Perhaps the stimulus checks were spent on food, which would, of course, be a good use of the money. While it is disappointing that we are not being utilized as much right now, our workers are doing God's work and their efforts are recognized. I just felt you should know so when people tell you of what others are doing you can say we have a very active pantry meeting the needs in our area.

Its not just a matter of packing the boxes and giving them out. There is the shopping at Manna and other stores each week, picking up of donated goods, and storing them on our shelves. I know they don't want praise but I think you will agree that they have earned it! They are there in all kinds of weather every single week. Please pray for our pantry crew, that their strength and health hold as they donate so much of their time and talent in this worthy endeavor.

The Corpus Christi Procession


In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of Corpus Christi—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional Corpus Christi procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our

churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The Corpus Christi procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated—and to be lived.
