THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - Couples should make an appointment with the priest or deacon at the time of engagement and at least six months in advance of any wedding date to begin preparations. No date should be set before that meeting so all canonical requirements are met. One party must be registered and an active Catholic. All weddings take place inside the Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF SICK - The anointing of the sick can be administered to anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness. Please call the church office to make arrangements to be anointed. In an emergency, please use ext. 1, leave a message with your name and phone number. You will be contacted as soon as possible.

For faith formation and youth ministry, there are two options during the pandemic:

1. Watch the St. Barnabas DRE channel on YouTube for the weekly video and make a comment on YouTube for credit.
2. Read and take notes on the chapters assigned, either in your physical textbooks, or by asking Simeon Willis to sign your child(ren) up for the free online textbook. The online version will read the content aloud with a quiz at the end. Otherwise they are the same as each other.

The YouTube videos also feature content for adults and a link to them is posted on the parish facebook page.

Use this time to enrich your prayer life, your family life, and your friendships. It is a great opportunity to start new prayer habits, begin a new spiritual reading book, and write letters or call friends and family.

Saint John Fisher (1469-1535) and Saint Thomas More (1477-1535) June 22

From Robert Bolt's classic *A Man for All Seasons* to Showtime's edgy *The Tudors*, Thomas More endears himself still: lawyer-statesman of impeccable integrity, remarried widower and affectionate father delighting in a lively household—four children, a pet monkey, even a paid jester! And challenges still: humanist-reformer, yet champion of Catholic faith and papal primacy. John Paul II named him Patron of Statesmen and Politicians, citing More's generous work, both as a lawyer and in government service, on behalf of the poorest and most marginalized people of his time, as well as his promotion of education for all sectors of society. More's decision for principle over politics, conscience over convenience prompted his final words: "I die the king's good servant, but God's first." Alone among England's bishops, John Fisher dared challenge Henry VIII's divorce and repudiation of the papacy. When the Pope named the imprisoned Fisher a cardinal, Henry thundered: "Don't bother sending Fisher's red hat here; I'll send Fisher's head to Rome!" Whose "good servants" are we first? Isn't a right conscience worth the pain of standing alone?

ENTUSIASMO Y GRAMÁTICA

Hay una buena razón para que los escritos de Pablo no se usen como modelos de gramática correcta hoy. La lectura de hoy nos ofrece un buen ejemplo de que para Pablo el mensaje tenía precedencia sobre la gramática. La primera oración es bastante larga y deja a los lectores sin aire; luego hay una serie de declaraciones que están hilvanadas sólo en la mente de Pablo. Pero, ¿qué importa? El fervor de Pablo es tan evidente que las palabras no le salen lo suficientemente rápidas para expresar sus ideas de manera ordenada. Los estudiosos de la Escritura regularmente interpretan su falta de sentido gramático como señal de la importancia de un pasaje en la Iglesia joven; como algo tan importante para ellos que el lenguaje que usaron nunca fue refinado.

¿Qué puede causar tal estado? ¿Contar la trama de una película de acción o describir jugada por jugada de un juego de fútbol? ¿Cuándo fue la última vez que estuvimos tan excitados por nuestra fe en Cristo que nos faltaba el aire al contarle, o cometíamos errores gramaticales por hablar con tanto entusiasmo? ¡Puede que sea ejemplo de mala gramática, pero es una manera excelente de inspirar a otros con el mensaje de Cristo!

Last week we ran an article about one of our fellow Vincentians, Teresa O'Neill, who is 96 years young and still very active in her ministry with St. Vincent de Paul. Yes, even from her bed and wheelchair in rehab after breaking her hip. Many of us have told Teresa how much we admire her. But what she really wants is not admiration, but for each of us to look into ourselves and discern the gifts that God has given us. Gifts that we can and should share with our church and community. No one is without a gift, and some have many gifts to share.

You may think that right now there is nothing to do at the church, not much is going on and needs are reduced. Actually, this is not true. Valarie is having a challenge finding people who will serve as liturgical ministers at Masses on the weekend. St. Vincent de Paul is serving many clients through the Pantry and assisting with bills, budgeting, and more. There are many people who are homebound out of necessity and prudence during the COVID-19 pandemic and could use a friendly call, and maybe some errands run for them.

There are so many diverse roles to fill, not the least of which is prayer for our community members and financial support. What is YOUR talent? How can YOU share some of the gifts God has given you? Wouldn't it be wonderful if more people offered to help our church so that we are not following the unfortunate but typical model of 20% of our parishioners doing 80% of the work?

Think it over... Give Valarie Brooks, our Volunteer Coordinator a call or email and talk with her about how you might fit in!

For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ and individually parts of one another. Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us exercise them: if prophecy, in proportion to the faith; if ministry, in ministering; if one is a teacher, in teaching; if one exhorts, in exhortation; if one contributes, in generosity; if one is over others, with diligence; if one does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness. (Romans 12:4-8)

La semana pasada publicamos un artículo sobre una de nuestras compañeras vicentinas, Teresa O'Neill, que tiene 96 años de edad y todavía es muy activa en su ministerio con San Vicente de Paul. Sí, incluso desde su cama y silla de ruedas en rehabilitación después de romperse la cadera. Muchos de nosotros le hemos dicho a Teresa cuánto la admiramos. Pero lo que realmente quiere no es admiración, sino que cada uno de nosotros nos mire a nosotros mismos y discierna los dones que Dios nos ha dado. Regalos que podemos y debemos compartir con nuestra iglesia y comunidad. Nadie está sin un regalo, y algunos tienen muchos regalos para compartir.

Puede pensar que en este momento no hay nada que hacer en la iglesia, no está sucediendo mucho y las necesidades se reducen. Actualmente, esto no es verdad.
