No date should be set before that meeting so all canonical requirements are met. One party must be registered and an active Catholic. All weddings take place inside the Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF SICK - The anointing of the sick can be administered to anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness. The Freedom to Make Health Decisions?

*Disclaimer: This is a political topic. The Catholic Church, in imitation of Jesus, is political by its nature and mission. It does not endorse particular candidates or party platforms, but does speak the truth on issues, whether popular or unpopular just as Jesus did. We all learn when we engage lovingly with each other to find the truth.

Ought people to be able to choose whether or not they receive the Covid-19 vaccine? This is a very divisive moral issue where people have strong opinions, and the Church has guidance to help navigate this situation. Before exploring that, however, let us dispel a few common misunderstandings.

It is a misreading of Pfizer and Moderna's testing procedures to claim that these vaccines have fetal cell material inside them. They were tested on fetal cell lines, but nothing more. This is not moral because it is profiting from abortion, but that is nothing new with pharmaceuticals: ibuprofen, Tylenol, Claritin, Lidocaine, and even Ivermectin were all tested on fetal cell lines, so it makes no sense to accept these and focus all our critiques on Pfizer and Moderna.¹ The Church has stated that receiving such treatments is remote cooperation with evil, which means that we are not sinning by taking a medicine or vaccine that was tested in this way provided we do not endorse the method of testing and encourage, in the ways we can, moral testing procedures.²

There are reasonable objections people can have to receiving a Covid-19 vaccine that do not stem from misunderstanding good information, or clinging to misinformation or conspiracy theories. Some of these include the person being at high risk of blood clots, or being at a potentially lower risk of complications from the virus compared to the vaccines. When using the CDC's

own Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS), one can evaluate the safety of various vaccines. For example, when comparing the MMR shots as a group over an eleven year period (2011-2021) to the Covid-19 shots as a group in 2020-2021, all other filters being equal, the following results are given: MMR=51 reports of death. Covid-19 vaccine=6,400+ reports of death. These numbers are a concern to some who are at a very low risk from the virus itself.³

When it comes to the idea of mandatory vaccinations, the Vatican has spoken: "At the same time, practical reason makes evident that vaccination is not, as a rule, a moral obligation and that, therefore, it must be voluntary."⁴ Taking a vaccine is a prudential decision which must only be freely made after weighing the risks and benefits. This holds even if someone's reasons for avoiding a vaccine are based on misinformation. This shows the importance of good information for informed decisions, but the voluntary reception of vaccines has the higher moral importance.

Hopefully this article will assist in constructive dialogue through dispelling myths both for and against being vaccinated while demonstrating the Church's official position on the necessity of voluntary vaccinations as the only moral path forward.
