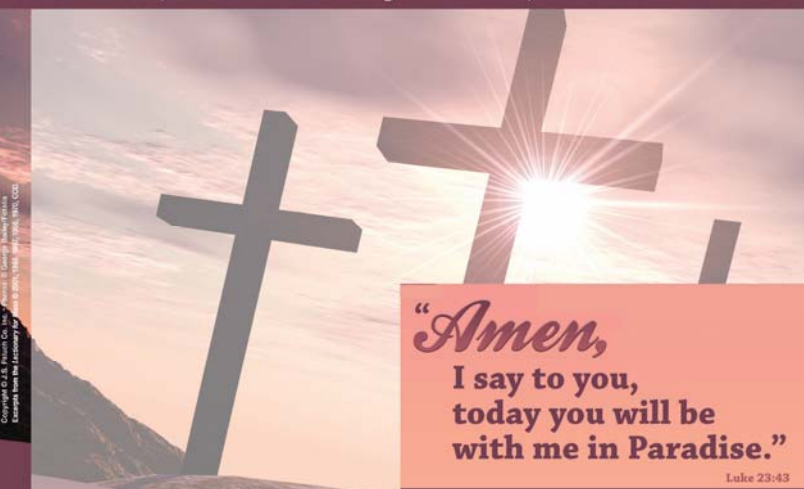

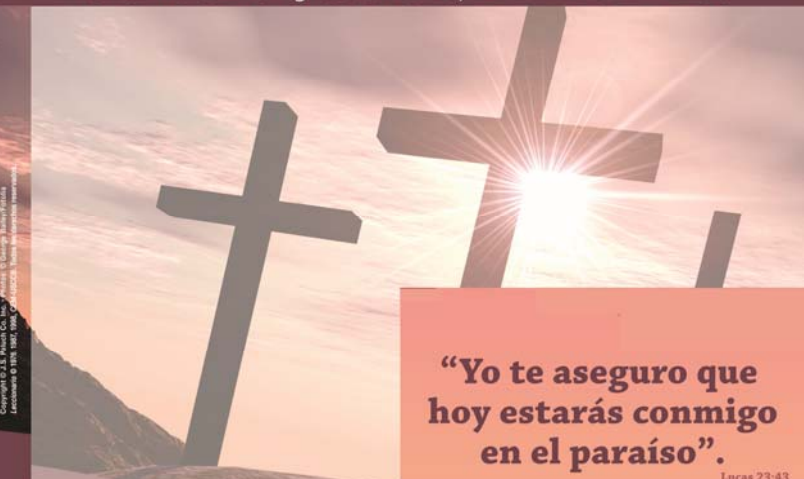

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - Men should call the parish priest or the Diocesan Vocation Director to help them discern their call to the Diaconate or Priesthood.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - Couples should make an appointment with the priest or deacon at the time of engagement and at least six months in advance of any wedding date to begin preparations. No date should be set before that meeting so all canonical requirements are met. One party must be registered and an active Catholic. All weddings take place inside the Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF SICK - The anointing of the sick can be administered to anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness. Please call the church office to make arrangements to be anointed. In an emergency, please use ext. 1, leave a message with your name and phone number. You will be contacted as soon as possible.

Vocational Awareness:

What can we do as a parish to increase religious and priestly vocations?

- ◆ Offer an hour of Adoration for our youth, seminarians and priests
- ◆ Encourage parents to discuss always doing God's will as a routine conversation with children of all ages
- ◆ Invite young people to pray with you, even if you are not related to them by blood
- ◆ Talk to teens and parents about what marriage is about: giving oneself to raise a family and get them to Heaven. When teens know what marriage is, and why it is beautiful, they will be able to discern more fruitfully if God is calling them to marry or becoming a priest or religious.
- ◆ Sponsor youth for diocesan retreats, such as Quo Vadis Days and Dun in Altum, so teens and young adults can see what religious life is like. One cannot love what one does not know.
- ◆ Encourage teens to consider faithful Catholic colleges (approved by the Newman Guide) These are some of the best places for encountering full scale support for discernment as a young adult.
- ◆ Help teens to see that there is no conflict between faith and science. 3/4 of all Catholic teens who leave the faith cite a perception of this conflict as a major reason for leaving.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's solemnity, the final feast of the Church year, is a youngster as feasts go. In 1925, Pope Pius XI was distressed by global political upheaval and the de-Christianizing of society. That year was a "Holy Year," keyed to the sixteen hundredth anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, when the words "and of his kingdom there will be no end" were added to the Creed. The Pope explained that although most feasts had developed over many centuries, the Church sometimes provided a new feast to address new needs. He pointed to the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, showing Christ's love and compassion in a time when many people embraced a cold and gloomy spirituality. Originally on the last Sunday of October, in the late 1960s the solemnity of Christ the King was moved to the last Sunday of the year.

Fresh from baptism's waters, we are anointed with chrism "as Christ was anointed priest, prophet, and king." This feast is a key to our identity. On this feast, we recognize Christ as a king who breaks the usual mold of kingship, and who shapes his kingdom with our hands, our words, our deeds of love and service.

La celebración de hoy de la Iglesia nos invita a ver más allá de nuestras lealtades nacionales y regocijarnos en nuestra primera identidad. Somos hijos de Dios en Jesús, Cristo el Rey. Nuestras lecturas nos ayudan a considerar cómo pertenecer al Reino de Dios. El libro de Samuel captura el profundo anhelo de los israelitas por un rey que los pastoree. San Pablo recuerda a los colosenses que pertenecemos al reino de Cristo, cuyo poder alaba en un hermoso himno.
